## Pupil Free Day

On Tuesday 12th March all staff were involved in Professional Development for our Pupil Free Day. All of our work was around our Site Improvement Plan.

Our main focus for the day was writing, looking at vocabulary in particular. We were very lucky to have 2 guest presenters for the day

- Sandy Russo from SPELD (Specific Learning Difficulties Association of South Australia) and Libby Brown from SERU (Special Education Resource Unit).

Both of these presenters are experts in the area of literacy.

Staff were able to make deeper connections between oral language, reading and writing. The three tiers of vocab were explored

- Tier one words being the everyday basic words
- Tier two words are targeted for instruction and should increase text comprehension
- Tier three words are low frequency specialised words.

A number of activities were undertaken by staff which will be transferred into classroom programs. Staff also had some time to focus on Mathematics, working through the Processes of Calculating using their resource folders. We finished the day in year level teams, where the writing focus continued.

Vocab or language walls will be appearing in all learning spaces around the school, so keep an eye out.

It was a very productive day for staff learning. We really value the opportunity to work as a staff team to ensure we give the best opportunities for our students.

## NAPLAN Online

On Thursday 28th March (week 9) all schools involved in transitioning to NAPLAN Online will be undertaking a National Co-ordinated Practice Test. This is to help with the move from paper to the online format, ensuring the national ICT and administering systems are in place before the tests occur in May. Vale Park will be involved in testing on this day – which may include students from Years 3, 5 and 7. This test will not provide student performance information.

All families of students in years 3, 5 and 7 received a "NAPLAN Online - Privacy Collection Notice" outlining this.

The National Practice Test is an opportunity for students to become more familiar with the layout of NAPLAN Online.



In Science students have been learning about electrical circuits through making quiz boards and wire loop games and have summarised their learning through writing a practical report detailing their aim, materials, procedure and results.




Other activities students have enjoyed include researching a famous Australian and making a model of the person, and making rain gauges which have used to measure and record rainfall.
