#### <u>Pupil Free Day</u>

On Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> June the Vale Park teaching staff and curriculum SSOs joined Trinity Gardens School for a day of training around Differentiation. The day was facilitated by Carol Le Lant and Jane Jarvis, from Flinders University.

This Pupil Free Day kicked off the start of a joint project where staff will continue to reflect on current practices and improve differentiation to cater for varying student learning differences and needs in their classrooms. Continued learning will occur through workshops at staff meetings and a coaching approach.

The three pillars of differentiation include: philosophy, principles and practices. Key messages from the day include: appropriate challenge for learning, having a growth mindset and fostering a climate of change.

### **Sports Administrator Position**

Thank you to Angela Horseman who has been our school Sports Administrator for the past seven years. She has done an outstanding job and has volunteered many hours into this important role. Unfortunately for us Angela will be stepping down from this role at the end of the year and therefore we will be seeking the services of a new Sports Administrator for 2020 and beyond.

Angela will assist the new Sports Administrator with a comprehensive hand over to allow an easier transition. This will be negotiated to occur in terms 3 or 4 2019.

This role has had an honorary payment. However, Angela has **generously** maintained the \$11 Administration Fee by volunteering many extra hours over and above what the honorary payment covers.

It is important to note that the \$11 Administration Fee has not seen an increase for more than ten years and this is not in line with other primary schools sport's administration fee. This will have to increase and depending on which option below (A or B) will depend on how much the Administration Fee will increase to.

At the last Sports Committee and Governing Council meetings it was discussed how to move forward with the Sport Administrator's role. There are two options:

- A. Increasing the Sports Administration fee to \$40 to increase the honorarium payment, therefore less volunteer hours required. This option is only possible if we find a suitable Sports Administrator.
- B. Possibility of employing an SSO to fill the position. This will increase the Sports Admin fee to \$70 per year. There will be a yearly review of this fee.

If neither of the above options are accepted by parents/caregivers then unfortunately out of hours school sport will not be possible.

Key Information about the Sport Administrator role:

- Required to be a member of the Vale Park Primary School Sports Committee.
- Current Responding to Abuse and Neglect (RAN) Training.
- Current DCSI Relevant History Screening or be willing to undertake such through the Department for Human Services (DHS). No cost to the applicant.
- Will be paid an honorarium determined and agreed upon by the Governing Council and School Sports Committee. This will be set at \$40 per child playing after school sports.
- Expectations of volunteer hours towards this role.
- Required to have a sound understanding and knowledge of, and abide by the Vale Park Primary Sports Policy.
- Have knowledge of WH&S practices.
- Coordination of all after school sport, working closely with the PE teacher.
- Determine fee structure for students/teams in collaboration with and the approval of the Sports Committee.
- Generate sports' notices along with the PE teacher, and after review by leadership and administration, distribute as required.
- Ensure each team has a coach (and manager if possible). Coaches are appointed with the approval of Vale Park Primary School Governing Council.
- Monitor coach and team manager Relevant History Screenings and RAN training.
- Scheduling of training and use of school sporting facilities.
- Liaise with relevant sporting bodies to enter teams into competitions.
- Ongoing communication between the school/sporting groups/parents and students.
- Distribute timetables and any other communications for the teams.
- Maintenance and record keeping of sporting equipment, uniforms and first aid supplies for teams.
- Liaise with the Front Office regarding payments and administrative matters.


